GENERAL REMARKS

Notwithstanding the extra accommodation provided a short time ago the problem is still acute. The College enjoys a well deserved reputation both in the academic results attained and in the conduct of its pupils, and it is no surprise to find the numbers ever on the increase. The primary classes give promise, in the type of pupil attending and in the good teaching done, that the excellent results in Junior and Leaving of last year will be maintained. Last year's lowest secondary class gave a deplorably poor account of itself in the finals.

The Syllabus for Religion is in a transition stage. In the meantime good work has been prepared in all classes along the lines of the old syllabus. A special word of praise is due to the writing in Grade III as also to the Arithmetic. Home Work in Grade V was of a high standard but systematic teaching of writing was missing in this room.

The Senior boys give a fine lead to the College. Their attitude and answering in the oral test could not be faulted. They work under the Superior in a vigorous branch of St. V. de Paul Society. The Holy Name and the Crusaders are also functioning. Good work is being done for the Missions. Last year provided a vocation to the Redemptorists and one to the Seminary.
